I am writing today to request time sensitive inclusion into the PSC Staffing Audit of the following documented reports that address staffing shortages in the NYS Utility Industry. We are further concerned with the additional expense and dramatic reductions in a trained and dedicated workforce due to the unprecedented outsourcing of traditional utility work. This imposes unnecessary additional costs to the customer and exposes the customer to risks of system reliability absent a workforce dedicated exclusively to day to day and emergency response within NYS franchise areas:
